Baltimore Police Department Uniformed Sensitivity Training

Each Tuesday evening (Wednesday evening if the prior Monday was a holiday), the police department is continuing a sensitivity training effort for uniformed officers. The sessions take place at Police Headquarters downtown from 6:30 to 9:30 PM. The department offers citizens transportation to police headquarters from the Goodnow Police Athletic League Center at 5310 Goodnow Road. Sessions include a light dinner with police officers followed by break-out groups watching videos depicting police and community interactions. After each video, citizens and police officers discuss the situations seen. 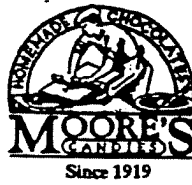
